- Deliver a variety of mini-lessons and coach adults with varying skills and abilities
- Modify delivery style (with TLG staff assistance) to accommodate varying skills of learners
- Update TLG staff members on availability for tutoring
- Provide feedback to TLG program staff for continuous improvement of program
